Dear Parents,

When you agreed to enroll NAME in the DAISY Diabetes Study, conducted by the University of Colorado School of Medicine, your child's blood was screened for diabetes gene markers.

About 1 in 300 children will develop Type 1 diabetes by the age of 20. This risk increases to 1 in 25 for children who have a parent or sibling with Type 1 diabetes. The risk for children who have a parent or sibling with Type 1 diabetes and who also have high risk genetic markers may be as high as 1 in 4.

Your child does not carry the high risk genetic markers. However, because your child has a parent or sibling with diabetes, your child continues to have a greater risk of developing diabetes than the average child, a 1 in 25 risk. This does NOT mean your child will definitely develop diabetes. We will continue to monitor your child closely and identify any important changes immediately. This will keep you and the research team informed about your child's health and will contribute much to increasing our knowledge about the causes of Type 1 diabetes.
