Dear Parents,
Your child had an OGTT, Oral Glucose Tolerance Test on
The OGTT measures how much your blood sugar rises after drinking a sweet liquid. How high your blood sugar level rises depends on how much insulin your islet cells are able to release. The OGTT can be used to diagnose diabetes.
Your child's results were: Impaired: (Not a 'normal' level but not diabetes)
Fasting blood sugar (Impaired range 110 – 126) 2 hour blood sugar (Impaired range 140 – 199)
We recommend:
Checking blood sugar levels once a week 2 hours after eating Checking blood sugar levels and ketones in urine with any illness, especially with vomiting. Repeating the OGTT in 6 months.
Watch for signs and symptoms of increased blood sugar:
Excessive thirst Excessive urination Bed wetting in a previously "dry" child Not wanting to eat much but wanting to drink Loss of energy Behavior changes Vomiting without diarrhea or fever Heavy breathing
