The results of your DAISY antibody tests, drawn on 5/9/2012, are as follows:

GAA: 25	Positive	(GAD Autoantibody)
IAA: -0.001	Negative	(Insulin Autoantibody)
IA-2: 6	Positive	(IA-2
ZnT8:	0.002 Negative	(ZnT8 Autoantibody)

This is a screening test to determine if antibodies to the pancreas are present. You were found to be positive for two or more diabetes antibodies. Being positive for multiple antibodies does not mean you will definitely develop Type 1 diabetes, however, this may significantly increase the possibility that you could develop diabetes at a later time. Because you are at a higher risk, it is important for you to be aware of the early symptoms of diabetes, which are:

**Increased thirst** Increased appetite with weight loss

**Increased urination** Vision Changes

Decreased energy Nausea

Vomiting (without diarrhea)

If you have two or more of the above symptoms please call our study nurse, Michelle Hoffman at 303-724-7555, your physician, or the Barbara Davis Center at 303-724-2323 and ask for Dr. Klingensmith or Carolyn Banion RN, PNP.

It is important to follow you closely; therefore we recommend repeating these tests at your child's next clinic visit to monitor these antibodies and to test your blood sugar. We will be contacting you one month before your child is due for a clinic visit to schedule this appointment.
