Dear Parents, The results of the DAISY antibody tests for JANE, drawn on 5/9/2012, are as follows:

GAA: 35	Positive	(GAD Autoantibody)
IAA: -0.001	Negative	(Insulin Autoantibody)
IA-2: 5	Positive	(IA-2
ZnT8: 0.002	Negative	(ZnT8 Autoantibody)

This is a screening test to determine if antibodies to the pancreas are present. Your child was found to be positive for two or more diabetes antibodies. Being positive for multiple antibodies does not mean your child will definitely develop diabetes, however, this may significantly increase the possibility that your child could develop diabetes during childhood. It is important to follow your child closely; therefore we recommend repeating these tests every 3 months to monitor these antibodies and to test your child's blood sugar.

Because your child is at a higher risk, it is important for you to be aware of the early symptoms of diabetes, which are:

Increased thirst	Decreased appetite for solid foods	
Increased urination	Bed wetting in a previously dry child	
Nausea	Yeast infection with a rash (especially in diaper area)	
Vomiting (without diarrhea)	Decreased energy	

If your child has two or more of the above symptoms please call our study nurse, Michelle Hoffman at 303-724-7555, your child's physician, or the Barbara Davis Center at 303-724-2323 and ask for Dr. Klingensmith or Carolyn Banion RN, PNP.
