Dear Parents,

The results of the DAISY Autoantibody tests for <u>name</u>, drawn on <u>date</u>, are as follows:

GAA: 35	Positive	(GAD Autoantibody)
IAA: -0.001	Negative	(Insulin Autoantibody)
IA-2: 5	Positive	(IA-2
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ZnT8: 0.002 Negative (ZnT8 Autoantibody)

This is a screening test to determine if Autoantibodies to the pancreas are present. Your child was found to be positive for two or more diabetes Autoantibodies. Being positive for multiple Autoantibodies means your child's risk has significantly increased. The risk is 70 in 100, that your child could develop type 1 diabetes during their lifetime. It is important to follow your child closely; therefore, we recommend repeating these tests every 3 months to monitor these Autoantibodies and to test your child's blood sugar.

Because your child is at a higher risk, it is important for you to be aware of the early symptoms of diabetes, which are:

Increased thirst Change in appetite

**Increased urination** Bed wetting in a previously dry child

Nausea Yeast infections Vomiting (without diarrhea) Decreased energy
