Instructions: This form refers to the <u>prior 6 months</u> so that we can report usage practices per half year. The form is administered in-person at annual visits; at 6-month interim contacts certain items (highlighted in **green**) are skipped.

This is a fully scripted form, meaning that the administrator reads scripts and each item on the form with no rewording or probing (unless indicated). The intention is to record what the participant knows and does not know. The approach is to read the script, read the question, and wait for a volunteered response; if none is forthcoming, then say "For example..." and read the possible responses, leaving it to the participant to say "I don't know". In a few cases the list of possible responses is long and a laminated card is handed to the participant as the question is asked.
